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**Surgery Discharge Instructions**

\*\*\*\*CHECK THE INCISION SITE TWICE DAILY\*\*\*\*

OK post operative	NOT OK post op
Quiet for a day, increasing in activity	Quiet for more than a day or lessening activity
Cough occasionally	Coughing that worsens over two days
Nausea 24 hours	Vomiting continuing past 24hrs
Not Eat, drink or poop 24 hours	Same continuing past 24hrs
Occasionally lick/clean the incision site	Obsessive licking
Small amount of redness and itching as the incision heals	A rash, bumps, or extreme redness around the incision.
Weeping	Bleeding or draining

\*\*\*\*CHECK THE INCISION SITE TWICE DAILY\*\*\*\*

Please Note: Complimentary recheck in \_\_\_\_\_ days

\_\_\_\_\_ **Limit activity level for 7-14 days, leash walk... No running, jumping, or stairs. Absolutely NO CONTACT with other pets (especially females in HEAT).**

\_\_\_\_\_ Keep indoors and do not bathe 7-14 days. This will help prevent infection.

\_\_\_\_\_ Diet... first water then and add small amounts of food, increasing to normal over 2-3 days.

\_\_\_\_\_ Sutures are mainly absorbable or internal.

\_\_\_\_\_ There are skin sutures visible they need to be removed in 7-14 days.

\_\_\_\_\_ Most bandages need to be removed or changed in 2-3days unless otherwise instructed.
